

Annual TS Eliot Cambridge Lecture 2012

The Annual TS Eliot Cambridge Lecture will be given this year by Dr Jeremy Noel-Tod of the University of East Anglia.

Its title is *The Long Song of J. Alfred Prufrock*.

Dr Jeremy Noel-Tod <http://www.uea.ac.uk/lit/People/Jeremy+Noel-Tod> is Lecturer in Literature and Creative Writing at the University of East Anglia.

His research concerns questions of style and form across a wide range of modern literature, with a particular interest in poetry; and his PhD thesis proposed the post-Romantic rhetorical mode of 'mock-prophecy' as a way of reading the work of T.S. Eliot. He has recently published a monograph examining Eliot's influence on post-war Anglo-American poetry, and an essay on W.H. Auden and Shakespeare.

He is currently editing the Oxford Companion to Modern Poetry.

Jeremy Noel-Tod came to UEA in September 2009. He studied at New College, Oxford and went on to teach at Oxford, Cambridge and UEA. He was Director of Studies at Selwyn College, Cambridge from 2007 to 2008, and completed a PhD at Trinity College, Cambridge in the same year. From 2008 to 2009 he lectured at Queen Mary, University of London.

The 2012 TS Eliot Cambridge Lecture will take place on Wednesday 14th November, 7pm, at The Cripps Theatre, Magdalene College, Cambridge.

The Lecture is open to all; admission is free and no tickets are required.
